Poor.

In debt on obligation to save harmless the plaintiff and inhabitants of N. from all charges that may happen, by placing A. or any poor person in cottage; the defendant pleads non daminific. The plaintiff replies, they were damnified by placing such a child in the said house, in being forced to provide necessaries for him, by reason of a rate set on the inhabitants by the major part of the justices and overseers. 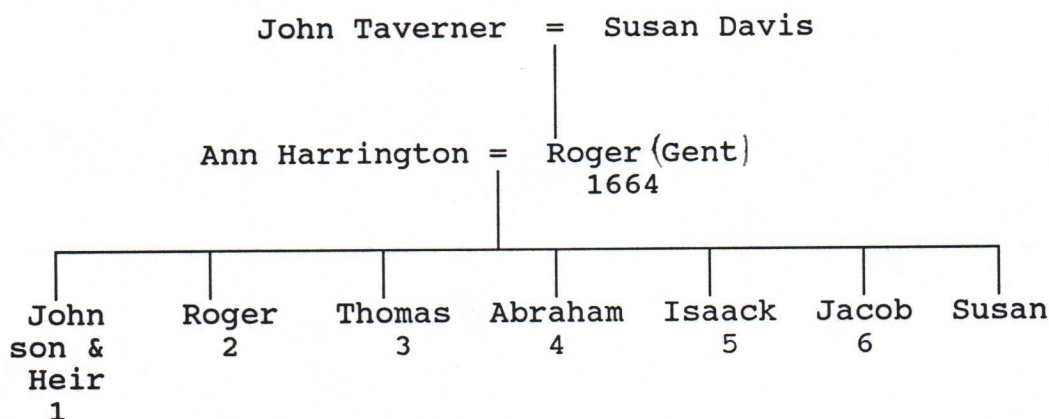
