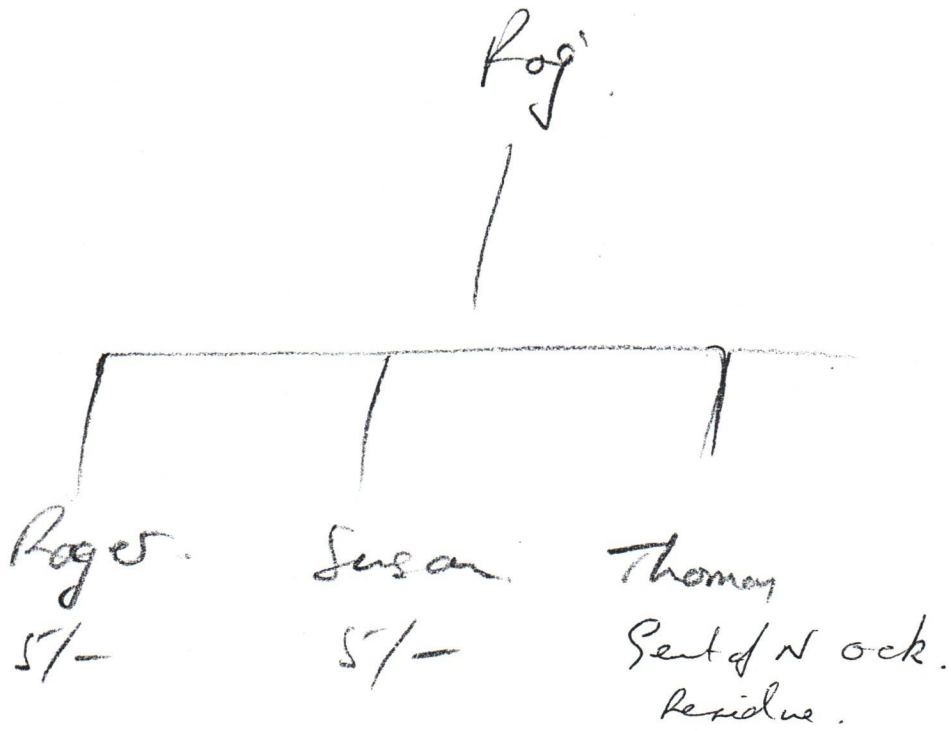

To my loving wife KATHERINE : three score & ten pounds to be paid unto her out of the principal money due upon a mortgage made from DENIS WRIGHT unto me and out of one bond & obligation made from the said DENNIS WRIGHT and out of one other bond & obligation made from THOMAS NEALE dec'd unto me with all interest & increase etc.

My executor to suffer & permit my said wife KATHERINE to aske & retaine of the said DENNIE WRIGHT the several sum of money.

To my daughter ELIZABETH wife of RALPH STONE : £30.

To my daughter SARAH wife of THOMAS HAWKES £50, twelve months after my decease.

To my son GEORGE TAVERNER : sum of 4 score pounds.

To my son WILLIAM TAVERNER : sum of 3 score pounds.

To my wife KATHERINE : bedsted & feather bed etc, within a month after my decease.

If any or either of my sons or daughters die before they receive their legacies then to his or her children and the children of the remaining legatee equally at the age of 14.

Residue of goods, chattells and personal estate after debts be paid shall within one year be divided equally amongst my sons and daughters GEORGE TAVERNER, WILLIAM TAVERNER, ELIZABETH STONE & SARAH HAWKINS.

GEORGE TAVERNER & WILLIAM TAVERNER, my sons, joint executors, also to enter into an obligation to such person as the rest of the legatees shall nominate under penalty of £300 for the true performance of my will.
