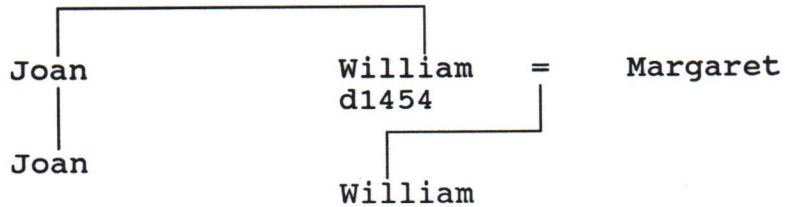

Exemplification, at the request of Robert Broker of London, of the tenour of the record and process of a suit before the king in Chancery, Michaelmas term, 31 Henry VI [1452], Middlesex, between John Bate, clerk of Chancery, and the said Robert, setting forth that John on 16 October, the fourth day of the quinzaine of the said Michaelmas, produced in person a bill against Robert present in court in the keeping of the keeper of the Flete, complaining that on 4 September 31 Henry VI [1452], in the parish of St Andrew, Holbourne, without the bar of the Old Temple, London, he entered John's house and carried away 30 ells of red worstede 3 ells in breadth, 40 ells of paled worsted, red, white and green, 3 ells in breadth, a whole bed of green worstede called a hongyngbedde, 16 coverlets of tapstrewarke, 12 pairs of sheets, 6 pairs of blankets, 12 cloths, 10 towels, 12 napkyns of twyllywarke, 6 cupbarclothes, a whole vestment for a priest, 6 brass pots, 4 garnysshe of peuvrevell, 6 brass bowls, 2 dishes, 2 basins and 12 candlesticks, worth 40 marks, and £6 in money by tale, and committed other enormities to the damage of £40; pledges John Taverner and Richard Sellerer; and Robert on Thursday following [19 October 1452] appeared in Chancery and said that John Bate ought not to bring the action since he is guiltless of forcible entry and the whole said trespass; and a day was given them, fifteen days from Hilary, and the sheriff of Middlesex was commanded to summon a jury of the parish.

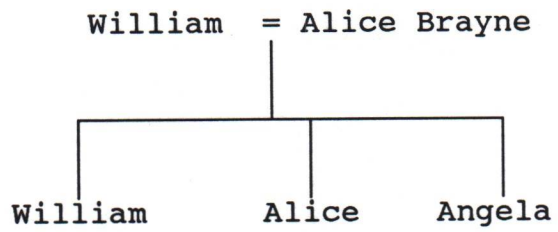
